LAURA J. LEDERER

Laura J. Lederer founded and directed The Protection Project at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government in 1997. In 2000, she moved The Protection Project to Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS). She is adjunct professor of law at Georgetown Law Center, where she has taught for seven years, including the first full course on international trafficking in persons offered at a law school. For five years she served as Senior Advisor on Trafficking in Persons to Under Secretary of State for Democracy and Global Affairs, Paula J. Dobriansky. She also directed a Global Projects on Trafficking in Persons at the Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking in Persons at the U.S. Department of State. In addition, for seven years she was the Executive Director of the Senior Policy Operating Group on Trafficking in Persons, a high level interagency policy group that staffed the President's cabinet-level Inter-agency Task Force on Trafficking in Persons. She is currently Vice President for Policy and Planning at Global Centurion, an NGO working to stop child sexual slavery.

CAROLINE OKUMU

Born and educated in England, and raised in Austria, Caroline Okumu started her career with the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) in Vienna, Austria, serving the United Nations Women's Guild (UNWG) and The Vienna International School (VIS). Okumu pursued educational and employment opportunities in the United States, where she served as the Assistant Comptroller for British global business services giant Rentokil Initial, plc., Washington, D.C. In pursuit of global opportunities, Okumu then served as the Manager for International Compensation, at Cable and Wireless, USA, a British telecommunications company headquartered in Vienna, Virginia. She managed a team of financial analysts in supporting the International and National Sales organization. Okumu currently serves as Director, Special Events at Smith Fairfield, Inc. (SFI), a full-service integrated communications and event management consulting firm specializing in Public Relations, Media Relations, Public Affairs, Marketing, Direct Response and Event Management. In addition, Okumu recently acquired a position to support The Society of White House Military Aides. Okumu is bilingual, her second language being German, and is currently pursuing admission into an EMBA entrepreneurial program at the London Business School, London, England.
